Dear Kelsey Civic Center Neighbors,

We would like to thank you for your patience as we continue to construct this 8-story, 112-unit, 100% affordable housing project near the corner of Van Ness Avenue and Grove Street. Aside from the sidewalk directly adjacent to our building lot and the parking lane beyond that area of the sidewalk, our work is limited to the project site. Our utility connections run through Dr. Tom Waddell, and that work is scheduled to commence the first week in August. Some short interruptions of alleyway traffic should be expected, and flaggers will be staged at the Polk Street entrance to assist with local traffic when through traffic is obstructed. We have emphasized to our trade partners completing work in the alley that keeping the impact of new construction to the community to a minimum is a priority.

What Are the Upcoming Activities Over the Next Month?

We have completed our window installation and are 95% complete with our roof. Our trade partners are building out our interior units and courtyard. The installation of the exterior wall framing/sheathing and waterproofing is nearing the top levels and once completed, will allow us to install the final finishes of the building. The utility work on Dr. Tom Waddell is starting this month. Our jobsite trailers located in the parking lane adjacent to the project site along Van Ness Avenue will be removed the first week of August. The tower crane – a project staple, is tracking to be dismantled the weekend of August 24th and 25th.

Over the next few months, site activities will mostly include work related to the exterior facades and the unit interiors. The pedestrian walkway on Van Ness Avenue and Grove Street will shift slightly while the sidewalk work is being completed. We have installed a pedestrian walkway canopy along Dr. Tom Waddell Place and scaffolding is erected over this canopy and within our fence line around the building. Netting has been installed on the scaffolding with signs that include renderings of the future building.

As you may have seen, we have added additional wood paneling fencing around the perimeter of our jobsite. A live guard patrols the jobsite after hours.

What Day & Times Will Construction Activities Occur?

Our typical workday is 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Crews may start organizing onsite around 6:30 a.m. but no construction noise will be generated until 7 a.m. While we aim to avoid weekend work, Saturday work is to be expected over the next few months to ensure the project remains on schedule. Saturday work will typically take place between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Construction activities will not normally occur on Sundays, holidays, or during overnight hours, however, it may occasionally be necessary to work during those hours. In those instances when traffic along Dr. Tom Waddell Place or neighboring streets may be affected, we will provide advanced notice via e-mail newsletter.

We do not plan to have any additional concrete pours at night.
